How-to: Adding +12V outlet to center console box

I wanted to add a +12V outlet to the center console box so that I could hide my mobile phone charger or the like without cables dangling around. I found some references in one of the Euro cup-holder threads to someone else who did this, but the pics were not directly linking any longer, so I thought I'd pass along what I did and some pics...

First, I removed the rear of the center console. In my 2007 B6, I don't have an ashtray, so the the lower trim panel had to be removed and two screws removed. You can then pull up & out on the rear of the console (assembly with the vents and all) and with a little persuasion the assembly will come off. Disconnect the +12 wiring harness connector.

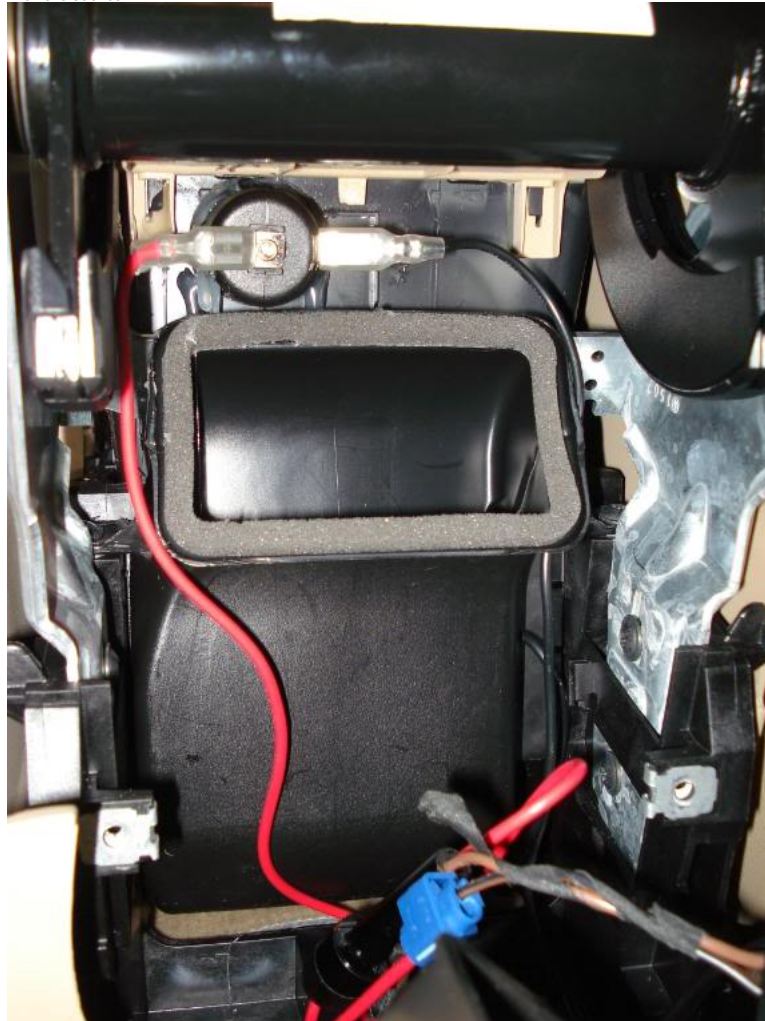
The most accessible location for the +12V socket is in the upper / right edge of the storage box (looking from inside the box). I used a +12V add-on outlet from Radio Shack (Model 270-1556)



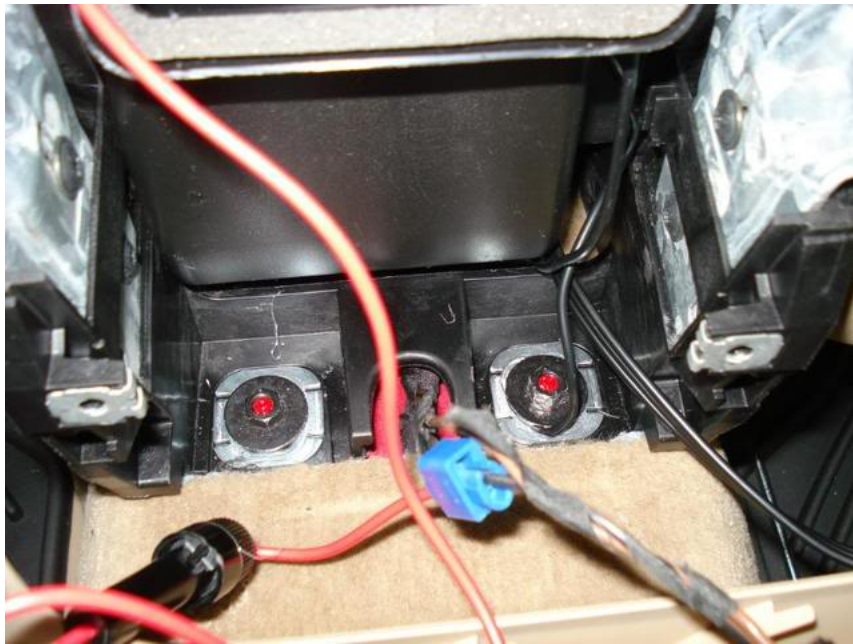
This outlet calls for a 1 & 3/32 drill bit. I could not find a 1 & 3/16 drill bit, so I purchased a 1 1/4 bit as I was not thinking. Well, turns out such a hole is too large for the press-tabs to catch

Be forewarned - use a 1" bit and then work the hole with a file or Dremel to expand as needed to get the socket to fit..... Fortunately, a little hot-glue on the inside of the socket lip and more on the back-side solved what could have been a frustrating problem.

I connected the +12 wire from the socket to the existing convience outlet wiring harness (black w/stripe) using the splice connector that came with the socket.



The instructions for the 12V socket said not to connect the ground wire to anything plastic, so instead of splicing into the ground wire on the harness (brown), I connected the new +12 socket's ground to the frame which the console is bolted to. I'm not quite sure why this is the case as there are plenty of ground wires in socket connectors (such as the existing 12V harness). Perhaps this warning was just a CYA, or perhaps it was to be clear not to connect to some metal that was actually isolated from the car's frame... anyway, I was able to test for continuity to ground through the car frame at the bolt shown in the pic, so I went with that. If it proves problematic, then I'll move the ground wire to a tap off the existing harness.



Not much left to do but to assemble everything back..... while I had the cover off I took the opportunity to do a few other mods which I'll capture later in another post if anyone is interested.

- 1) run a new AUX input line from my DICE i-VW-R iPod integration to the glove-box location and
- 2) install a set of RCA jacks for audio/video to provide a source to removable rear LCD panels for the kids (originating from a DICE iPod Video Cradle)
